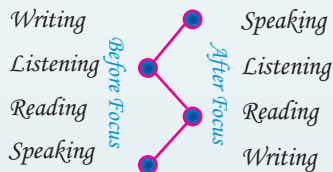
Why do we need a training program in spoken English?

OUR SCIENTISTS



PROF. JITENDRANATH GOSWAMI
(DIRECTOR OF PHYSICAL RESEARCH LABORATORY, AHAMEDABAD AND PRINCIPAL SCIENTIST OF THE CHANDRAYAAN - 1)

PROFILE:

Prof. Jitendra Nath Goswami was born in 1950 in Assam and obtained his B.Sc., and M.Sc. degrees in Physics from the Gauhati

University, Assam. His Ph.D. work dealt with studies of cosmic Ray records in Lunar Sample and Meteorites.

He spent several Years at the university of California, Berkeley and at San Diego.

For post-doctoral research, over the years he had visited Washington University, St.Louis Vernadsky Institute, Moscow, Lunar and Planetary Institute, Houston and Max-Planck Institute visited Mainz for extended periods for conducting collaborative and Independent research.

ACHIEVEMENTS:

Prof. Goswami's research encompasses studies of the origin and early Evolution of the Solar System, Solar Stellar relationship Energetic particles in space, evolution of Moon, Asteroids and Meteorites and Geochronology. He was a co-investigator of the Indian cosmic Ray Experiment conducted on-board Space Shuttle Space Lab - 3 and is a Principal Investigator of Lunar Samples.

He has more than a hundred and fifty publications and a dozen invited review articles in peer reviewed journals. He is currently a fellow of all the three Science academics in India and also a Council Member of the Indian Academy of Sciences, Bangalore and National Academy of Sciences, Allahabad. He has been elected an honorary fellow of the Royal Astronomical Society in 2008. He took the responsibility as the Principal Scientist of the Chandrayaan - 1 Mission and also contributing towards planning of future Indian Planetary Missions.

AWARDS:

Prof. Goswami has received various awards and honours that include INSA Young Scientist Award , Young Associate of Indian Academy of Sciences, the NASA Group Achievement Award and the Shanti Swarup Bhatnagar Award in Earth and Planetary Sciences.

Goswami said "If everything goes as per the plan, we will be ready to send a man to moon by 2020." He felt proud to be part of the Historic Moon Mission and spelt out other programmes in the pipeline.

"We should stress on the need to help children get attracted towards science and space technology by urging parents to do something inspirational. "Parents and guardians can inspire their children to achieve something in life."

What should you say if you're caught doing something wrong? Apologize, first. Then, if you can do anything to repair the damage, do it.

All of us make mistakes. The question is, how do we respond to them? If we try to weasel out of trouble, point the finger at others, and deny responsibility, all we do is make ourselves look bad and lose the respect of those around us.

All we do is show the adults involved that we are still acting like little kids. So if you get caught, don't say, "It wasn't me." Or, "Those other guys were doing it first." Or, "I didn't know."

If you make a mistake, have the courage to say, "I messed up, and I'm sorry. How can I fix it, or make up for it?" Then follow through. People are ready to forgive you—but only if you're ready to take responsibility. Apologize, fix it, and move on. That kind of response will earn admiration and respect.

I once saw two students sweeping the entranceway to their school after having been caught for a minor misdeed. One of them saw this task as a punishment, while the other saw it as doing service to the school. The first one was angry at being caught and still refused to accept responsibility for what he had done.

The second had admitted his mistake, apologized, and asked what he could do to balance the scales. It wasn't a big deal, but this incident spoke volumes about each of these two individuals. They were the same age, but one was still a boy, while the other was clearly a young man on the way to become a responsible adult.

A few words about cheating

Have you ever copied homework from a friend? Used a "cheat-sheet" during a test? Plagiarized an essay or report? Far too many students would answer "yes".

Why do students cheat?

First, because they are desperate. Bad habits have put them into a corner: their homework's not done, they aren't ready for the test, or they've put off writing the paper that's almost due.

Second, they're still thinking like little kids instead of responsible young adults. They think that if they "get away" with cheating, they will be better off. If they don't realize that they are only cheating themselves. If they earn good grades for work they didn't do, they aren't learning what the work was supposed to teach them. And no matter who else believes them, they will look into the mirror and see a cheater.

What's the right thing to do if you find yourself in a corner and make the wrong choice? You already know: take responsibility, apologize, fix it, and move on. Then when you look in the mirror, you won't see a cheater. You'll see someone who messed up but was courageous and smart enough to be honest about it.

SCINTILLATING SPORTS : KHO - KHO

Popular desi traditional sports in India, especially in Andhra Pradesh. The origin of Kho-Kho is difficult to trace with its origins in Maharashtra, Kho-Kho in ancient times, was played on 'raths' or chariots, and was known as RATHERA.

The rules of the game were framed in the beginning of the 20th century. At Gymkhana Poona, a committee was formed in 1914, to frame its rules.

Each team consists of twelve players, but only nine players take the field for a contest. A match consists of 2 innings. An inning consists of chasing and running of turns of 7 minutes each. Eight member of the chasing team sit in their eight squares on the central lane, alternately facing the opposite direction, while the ninth member is an active chaser, and stands at either of the posts, ready to begin the pursuit. Members of the chasing team have to put their opponent out, touching them with their palms, but without committing a foul.

All the action in Kho-Kho is provided by the defenders, who try to play out the 7 minutes time, and the chasers who try to dismiss them.

A defender can be dismissed in three ways:

If he is touched by an active chaser with his palm without committing a foul.

If he goes out of the limits on his own.

If he enters the limit lane.

Defenders enter the limit, in batches of three. After the third and last defender of batch is out, the next batch must enter the limits, before a 'Kho' is given by the successful active chaser. Defenders have full freedom of movement on both sides of central lane, but the active chaser cannot change the direction to which he is committed. He cannot cross the central lane. An active chaser can change position with a seated chaser, by touching him from behind by palm, and uttering the word 'Kho' loudly, and simultaneously chase or attack is build up by a series of 'Khos' as the chase continues with a relay of chasers.

At the end of the innings there is an interval of 5 minutes and an interval of 2 minutes, in between the turns. Each side alternates between chasing and defence. Kho-Kho can be played by men, women, and children of all ages. The game requires a very small piece of evenly surfaced grounds, rectangular in shape and 27m by 15m.

The only equipment required are the two poles. The game lasts no more than 37 minutes.

Though Kho-Kho is an interesting game, it is not so famous due to less popularity. It is mostly played in southern India.

Govt. should take necessary steps to make people aware of the game and consider it as a National Game by giving opportunities.

6. Making conversant with the most 500 common sentences for day to day use.
7. Creating discussion time at least for 15 minutes in a day among students.

9. Awarding suitably the good spoken-students periodically onto the dais.
10. Habituating the students to read the English magazines and go to Library to go to Library and go through the Daily News Papers.

The trend of the Spoken-English can be changed if the trend of the students is changed. The teachers should encourage the students especially from lower sections i.e. V to VII from concept sections to come on to the dais and speak on their selected and trained topics at least for 3 to 5 minutes every day. Swami Vivekananda's Address to the World Parliament of Religions September 1893



Sisters and Brothers of America, It fills my heart with joy unspeakable to rise in response to the warm and cordial welcome which you have given us. I thank you in the name of the most ancient order of monks in the world; I thank you in the name of the mother of religions, and I thank you in the name of millions and millions of Hindu people of all classes and sects. My thanks, also, to some of the speakers on this platform who, referring to the delegates from the Orient, have told you that these men from far-off nations may well claim the honor of bearing to different lands the idea of toleration. I am proud to belong to a religion which has taught the world both tolerance and universal acceptance. We believe not only in universal toleration, but we accept all religions as true. I am proud to belong to a nation which has sheltered the persecuted and the refugees of all religions and all nations of the earth. I am proud to tell you that we have gathered in our bosom the purest remnant of the Israelites, who came to Southern India and took refuge with us in the very year in which their holy temple was shattered to pieces by Roman tyranny. I am proud to belong to the religion which has sheltered and is still fostering the remnant of the grand Zoroastrian nation. I will quote to you, brethren, a few lines from a hymn which I remember to have repeated from my earliest boyhood, which is every day repeated by millions of human beings: "As the different streams having their sources in different places all mingle their water in the sea, so, O Lord, the different paths which men take through different tendencies, various though they appear, crooked or straight, all lead to Thee." The present convention, which is one of the most August Assemblies ever held, is in itself a vindication, a declaration to the world of the wonderful doctrine preached in the Gita: "Whosoever comes to Me, through whatsoever form, I reach him; all men are struggling through paths which in the end lead to me." Sectarianism, bigotry, and its horrible descendant, fanaticism, have long possessed this beautiful earth. They have filled the earth with violence, drenched it often and often with human blood, destroyed civilization and sent whole nations to despair. Had it not been for these horrible demons, human society would be far more advanced than it is now. But their time is come; and I fervently hope that the bell that tolled this morning in honor of this convention may be the death-knell of all fanaticism, of all persecutions with the sword or with the pen, and of all uncharitable feelings between persons wending their way to the same goal.

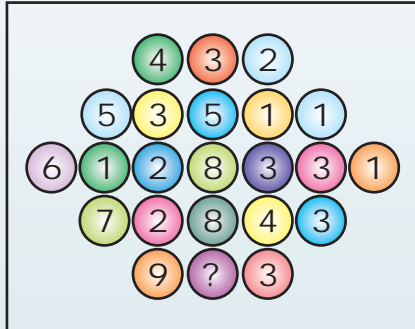

- ☞ The Sun makes up 99.86% of the Solar System's mass! That means that all the planets put together (including Jupiter) as well as all the asteroids only make up about 0.14% of the Solar System's mass That Jupiter's magnetic field is so massive that it pours billions of Watts into Earth's magnetic field every day! That a massive body 100km wide travelling at over 512,000km/h crashed into Mercury to form the Caloris Basin. The impact was so great it sent shockwaves round Mercury creating its hilly lineated terrain. That just a pinhead of the Sun's raw material could kill someone up to 160 kilometers away!
- ☞ That Olympus Mons (on Mars) is the largest Volcanic mountain in the Solar System. It is 600 km across and 27 km high!
- ☞ That a Supernova explosion produces more energy in its first ten seconds than the Sun during the whole of its 10 billion year lifetime and that for a brief period, it creates more energy than the rest of a galaxy put together!!
- ☞ That the comet with the longest ever recorded tail is the Great Comet of 1843. Its tail stretched over 800 million kilometres! This is about the same distance the Earth is from Jupiter!

OBESITY

Obesity is a medical condition in which excess body fat has accumulated to the extent that it may have adverse effect on health, leading to reduced life expectancy. Fat tissue from obese people doesn't oxidize fatty acids as well as that from thinner people.

The Greeks were the first to recognize obesity as a medical disorder. Hippocrates wrote that corpulence is not only a disease in itself but harbinger of others'. Famous Indian surgeon sushruta related obesity to diabetes and cardiac disorders.

Body mass index (BMI), a measurement which compares weight and height define the people as over weight when their BMI is between 25kg/m² and 30kg/m², and obese when it is greater than 30kg/m²

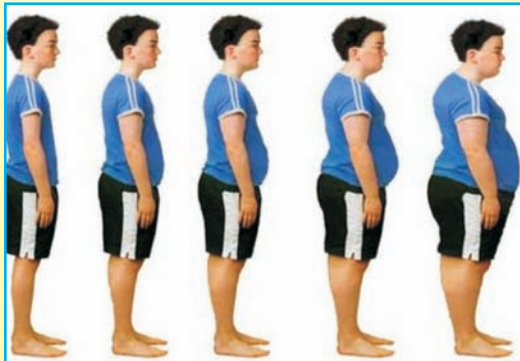
Obesity increases the likelihood of various diseases particularly heart diseases, type 2 diabetes, breathing difficulties, renal problems, certain type of cancer and osteoarthritis.

30 – 34.9	Class I obesity
35 – 39.9	Class II obesity
≥ 40	Class III obesity

Obesity is most commonly caused by a combination of excessive dietary calories, lack of physical activities and genetic susceptibility. A new study found that obese mothers were ten times more likely to have obese daughters and obese fathers more likely to have obese sons. However, children of opposite gender of obese parents are unaffected.

Understanding the scientific basis of obesity will help to identify mechanisms to manage and treat obesity effectively.

Primary treatment for obesity is dieting and physical activity may be taken to reduce appetite or inhibit fat absorption. In severe cases surgery is performed to reduce the stomach volume.

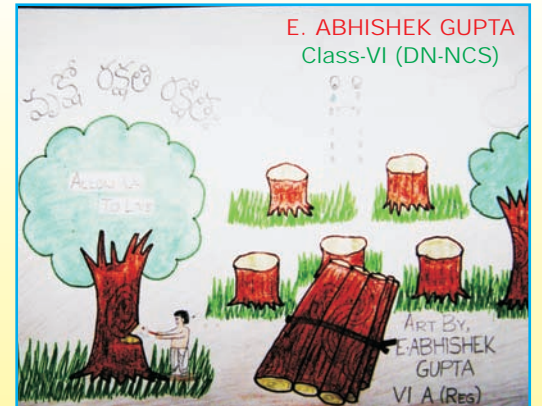


SOUTH AFRICA Vs. MEXICO
